



FABULOUS FINISHINGS

In this class you will learn (hands on) 4 different methods of binding as one type does not fit all quilts. Then you will be shown other methods that can be used. The fabric does not have to be fancy as these are done as samples, this way you have them forever.

SUPPLY LIST

Sewing machine in good working order with feet, cord, attachments and manual

1/4" foot

Walking foot

New sewing machine needle – Microtex 80/12

Neutral thread

Thread to match the 1 3/4" strip

Pins

Rotary cutter, 24" acrylic ruler and self-healing mat

Pencil to mark fabric

Seam ripper

Scissors for thread **and** fabric

FABRIC SUPPLIES

You will need 4 layered quilt squares that are 12 ½" – each square will have backing, batting and top fabric.

1 – 12 ½" square to make bias binding

2 – 2 ½" strips to make regular binding

2 – 1 ¼" strips to make a binding for placemats

2 – 1 ¾" strips - this should be a contrast to the 1 ½" strips

2 – 1 ½" strips

The 1 ¾" and 1 ½" strips will make a faux piping edge and the binding is all done on the machine
