

Machine Quilting With Rulers Supply List

- Sewing Machine in good working condition (including power cord, foot control, manual and extension table if you have one.
- 2 Bobbins
- Pick one of the following options for ruler foot and rulers. You will need to know the brand and model of your sewing machine.

	Rulerfoot	Straight Ruler	Curved Ruler
Option One	If you already have a rulerfoot and some rulers for rulerwork, at minimum you need a straight edge and a curve.		
Option Two	Rulerfoot specific for your machine	Angela Walters Slim or SID or similar ruler	Angela Walters Smiley or similar ruler
Option Three	Westeele Domestic Rulerfoot starter package (Has generic rulerfoot with a ruler that has a straight edge and curve – ask staff at Johnson's to help you with this option		
Option Four	Rulerfoot specific for your machine	Westeele Starter Arc Template – ask staff	
Option Five	Westeele Generic rulerfoot	Angela Walters Slim or SID or similar ruler	Angela Walters Smiley or similar ruler

- *****NOTE*****Many brands have a ruler foot specific for their brand. For individuals who have Janome Convertible Free Motion Quilting set, you can purchase the Convertible Rulerfoot set. .Other options are adding a ruler foot base to a shank appropriate for your machine made by Westeele.
- *****NOTE***** Please ensure you purchase rulers that are appropriate for the shank height of your machine. You are responsible for ensuring you have the correct height for your machine.
- Machine extension table needs to be fairly flat to prevent breakage of rulers
- Topstitch or Quilting needles 80/12 or 90/14 if using heavier threads
- Fabric marker or pen such as Blue B Gone or Pilot Frixion Pen for light fabric, light colored chalk for dark fabric
- Quilting ruler (6 x 24" or similar size) for marking sections
- Two contrasting threads
- 2 spools of contrasting cotton thread – you will want to see both colors on your fabric.
- Practice Quilt Sandwiches
 - 0.5 m unbleached cotton (muslin)
 - Make a quilt sandwich with batting in the middle – it should measure about 20 x 20
- Project Quilt Sandwich
 - 0.6 m cotton fabric that reads as a solid (broad cloth, sheeting) You can use patterned fabric for the backing. Make a quilt sandwich with the backing being 24 x 24 and the top and batting 22 x 2
 - Quilt batting (Quilters Dream Select preferred)
- Sketch book (inexpensive) or notebook with blank pages (NO Lined paper). This will be used to practice drawing designs before sewing them out.
- Pencil(s) and pencil sharpener if needed
- Quilting gloves – Machingers are my favorite but there are different varieties
- Basic sewing supplies
