



## **BROKEN DAISY PLACEMATS**

This pattern has sharp points, but as they are floating, it is very forgiving for a first paper piecing top. This is achieved by using a paper piecing method. You will sew on the paper and when finished, it is ripped out. I will also show you another method using 2 layers of freezer paper.

### **SUPPLY LIST**

Sewing machine in good working order with feet, cord and manual

¼" foot and if you have it, an open toe foot

80/12 Microtex needle

Neutral thread – either gray or beige

24" (or bigger) self-healing mat and 24" acrylic ruler

Rotary cutter

Seam ripper

Wash out glue

Flower head pins

Small iron and ironing surface if you have it

12" or 6" add a quarter ruler

Fold template – straight edge of template plastic or a post card

Large zip lock bags – for keeping your pieces organized

Large paper clips or binding clips

Pattern

Highlighting marker

Wooden iron

## **FABRIC REQUIREMENTS**

I only used four fabrics for the top. I combined the small points, bisecting strip and the binding.

2 m of background fabric

.5m of fabric for large points

.3m of fabric for the small points

.1m of fabric for the semi circles

.3m of fabric for the bisecting strip

.4m fabric for binding

1.5m fabric for backing

1.5m of sew in thermolam for batting
