



QUILT MAKING BASICS

In this class you will learn the basic piecing techniques as you construct blocks using squares and triangles. These blocks can then be made into a wall hanging or lap quilt. In the first class we will talk about the supplies and discuss the fabric requirements and assist you in the selection of fabrics and supplies. You will not need your sewing machines in the first class.

TECHNIQUES: squares and rectangles

- Strip piecing
- Corner matching
- Chain piecing
- Half square triangles
- Quarter square triangles
- Flying geese
- Sashing
- Borders

SUPPLIES: Fabric – to be discussed in the first class

- Sewing machine in good working order, attachments & manual**
- New 80/12 universal sewing machine needle**
- Quarter inch foot to fit your machine**
- Neutral colour cotton thread (medium gray or beige)**
- Silk pins (red and white heads)**
- 45mm rotary cutter**
- 24" acrylic ruler**
- self healing mat (24" in one direction)**
- 6 ½" square**
- small scissors, seam ripper**
- paper and pencil for taking notes**
- mechanical pencil (0.7mm lead)**
- White marking mechanical pencil (Fons & Porter) or chaco marker**
- Pointed tailors Awl**
